




Our vision is to lead the digital transformation of the pharmacy








Innovation in healthcare could be accelerated significantly




Regulation focused on existing (outdated) business models can delay innovation

- Regulation focused on fixing systemic problems instead of incentivising desired outcomes
- New regulation often try to solve within the boundaries of the existing structure
- Tenders often biased towards incumbent market players
- Unclear path from pilot in one municipality/region to broader roll-out

- Focus on rewarding the desired outcome
- Regulate the fundamentals not the details
- Allow for incremental development, follow-up and adjustments
